

Tromboembolismo Pulmonar com um Trombo no Coração Direito: Uma Rara Associação

Pulmonary Thromboembolism with a Thrombus in the Right Heart: An Unusual Association

A 69-year-old woman with history of high blood pressure and obesity was taken to emergency department due to asthenia, dyspnea and central cyanosis. She was conscious, but hypotensive, tachycardic, tachypneic and with increased capillary refill time. The arterial-blood gas (10 L / min) revealed metabolic acidemia, hypoxemia, hypocapnia and hyperlactacidemia and the blood test leukocytosis, neutrophilia, C-reactive protein elevation and acute renal injury. The chest X-ray showed enlargement of the right chambers and right lower lobe consolidation. Preliminary diagnosis was sepsis triggered by pneumonia with hemodynamic response to fluid therapy. However, persistent hypoxemia after 48 hours of antibiotic therapy led to pulmonary thromboembolism (PE) suspicion. Transthoracic echocardiogram revealed dilated right ventricle (RV), with septum flattening, and a large thrombus (type A) in the right atrium protruding to the RV¹ (Figs. 1 and 2). The scintigraphy confirmed PE. The etiological study revealed left popliteal and right gemellar veins thrombosis, and heterozygosity for two polymorphisms of methyldethahydrofolate reductase (C677T and A1298C) with hyperhomocysteinemia. She maintained anticoagulation (LMWH),² with clinical and RV function improvement and without evidence of thrombus on echocardiogram on the 10th day. However, on the 14th day, she suddenly developed dyspnea with subsequent cardiorespiratory arrest and death. ■
